

## **Cancer Program Standards 2012: Ensuring Patient-Centered Care**

This manual encompasses the restructured requirements that each program must meet prior to survey and includes the revised and new standards that must be met in order to obtain CoC Accreditation.

The manual includes standards that are designed to address patient-centered needs including mechanisms to address psychosocial distress, manage health care barriers and disparities through a patient navigation process, deliver genetic testing and counseling, and provide for preparation and distribution of a survivorship care plan at the conclusion of treatment. The standards have also been enhanced to increase the focus on evaluating the quality of care and outcomes through the introduction of expected performance levels for accountability and quality improvement measures, as well as an annual study that assesses the appropriateness of patient evaluation and treatment planning.

## **AJCC Staging Desk Reference**

The American Joint Committee on Cancer (AJCC) has developed the Staging Desk Reference to serve as a handy tool for use when abstracting cancer cases. The Staging Desk Reference is not intended to replace the Seventh Edition AJCC Cancer Staging Manual, but rather serve as a useful resource that can quickly and easily provide specific information relevant to staging.

The first section, General Staging Rules, provides the TNM rules formatted for quick access. Chapter 1 of the Cancer Staging Manual provides more information and context, but the basic rules are provided in the Staging Desk Reference. The Cross Reference section was created to help registrars quickly match ICD-0 codes, CSv2 schemas, and AJCC manual chapters. Two frequently used cross references are provided in this section, the first organized by ICD-O-3 Site Code, and the second by AJCC manual chapter. These features provide users with two options for finding information they need. This booklet will be particularly useful when trying to determine which AJCC staging form to use for a particular code. Finally, the Head and Neck Nodes section provides a helpful tool for identifying nodes in an often confusing part of the anatomy.

## **Beyond the Morbidity and Mortality Conference: Analysis of Surgical Errors and Complications in Contemporary Practice**

The analysis of surgical errors and complications, ranging from near misses to those causing death, can provide critical learning opportunities to improve outcomes. This interactive, online, case-based program developed by the ACS Division of Education, discusses the analysis of errors and complications, and presents a straightforward method of critical evaluation that can be used by individual surgeons or surgical teams.

Join William C. Mackey, MD, FACS., and Michael Tarnoff, MD, FAC., from Tufts Medical Center, Boston, MA, as they discuss processes and techniques that have been used successfully and can be readily applied in many environments. ### Communicating with Patients about Surgical Errors and Adverse Outcomes

This educational DVD (Windows and MAC platform) addresses the essential principles of communicating with patients about surgical errors and adverse outcomes. Research has revealed that physicians and patients have very different perspectives regarding these issues, and this DVD presents viewpoints of each group. Critical concepts for understanding and approaching conversations regarding surgical errors and adverse outcomes are presented by Drs. Thomas Gallagher and John Banja during surgical grand rounds at Emory University Hospital, Atlanta, GA. In addition, three vignettes involving a retained sponge, an operating room burn, and a common bile duct injury depict surgeons interacting with patients in these scenarios using a variety of strategies and approaches. Discussion points for each vignette are provided.

The content does not provide legal advice, nor does it establish a standard of care for disclosing surgical error. Practicing surgeons may use this DVD to earn continuing medical education credit (2.5 CME hours).
