ALABAMA STATE-MANDATED CME CONTENT REQUIREMENTS

<p>CME Requirements At-A-Glance</p>	<p>Renewal cycle: Annual – All licenses expire December 31 of each year</p> <p>Minimum CMEs: 25 CME per annual renewal cycle</p> <p>State-mandated CME content</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 2 CME every two years in Controlled Substance Prescribing
<p>State-Mandated CME Content Detail</p>	<p>Any program conferring Category 1 Credit in the areas of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • controlled substance prescribing practices, • recognizing signs of the abuse or misuse of controlled substances, or • controlled substance prescribing for chronic pain management <p>is acceptable to meet the CME credits required of all Alabama Controlled Substances Certificate registrants every two years. You do not need to obtain pre-approval of the courses you choose.</p>
<p>Notes</p>	<p><i>ACSC holders who are otherwise exempt from the CME requirement (residents, fellows, initial licensure year, military service) are still required to obtain 2 Controlled Substance Prescribing credits every two years.</i></p>
