<b>CME Requirements At-A-Glance</b>	<p><b>Renewal cycle:</b> <a href="#">Biennial – All licenses expire on April 30 of odd-numbered years</a></p> <p><b>Minimum CMEs:</b> <a href="#">No CME requirement for licensees who have actively practiced medicine for the preceding two years</a></p> <p><b>State-mandated CME content</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>N/A</li> </ul>
<b>State-Mandated CME Content Detail</b>	<p>N/A</p>
<b>Notes</b>	<p>On March 14, 2019, the revised <a href="#">Guidelines for Prescribing and Dispensing Opioids</a> were adopted by all six of Colorado’s prescribing and dispensing boards including the Colorado Medical Board.</p>
