The following are a few recent updates that I hope you'll find useful in your role as the CLP for your program.

## **CoC Releases New Smoking Cessation Standard**

Based on the success of its Just Ask and Beyond Ask quality improvement projects, the Commission on Cancer (CoC) has developed <u>Standard 5.9</u>: <u>Smoking Cessation for Patients with Cancer</u>. An updated version of the CoC accreditation standards, <u>Optimal Resources for Cancer Care (2020 Standards)</u>, will be released this fall and will include Standard 5.9.

Additional resources regarding Standard 5.9 are available:

- The Standards Resource Library, accessible via the Resources page in QPort, includes a Frequently Asked Questions document, an implementation packet, and an Electronic Health Records guidance video.
- On October 28 at 3:00 pm CT, the CoC will host the webinar <u>CoC: Smoking Cessation Standard</u>.
  Presenters will review the evidence for the standard and provide an overview of compliance requirements.

### **Revisions Announced for Standard 4.2: Oncology Nursing Credentials**

Beginning January 1, 2026, the revised version of CoC <u>Standard 4.2: Oncology Nursing Credentials</u>, will feature streamlined documentation and compliance requirements. Cancer programs must demonstrate compliance with the revised standard by assessing oncology nursing continuing education and competency for all nurses providing direct oncology care.

# **Updated Requirements for Annual Report to Cancer Committee**

The CoC is providing clarification regarding requirements for annual reports that must be presented to the cancer committee and documented in the meeting minutes. Read more.

### <u>Alternative Pathway for Standard 9.1 Compliance</u>

The CoC and National Accreditation Program for Breast Centers, recognizing that accredited programs are struggling to accrue required percentages of patients to participate in clinical research, are offering an alternative pathway for Standard 9.1: Clinical Research Accrual compliance for activity from 2025 through 2028. Read more.

#### **NCDB Update**

- The National Cancer Database (NCDB) has added one new primary site for Hepato-Pancreato-Biliary (HPB) cancer and five new quality measures. Three of these quality measures relate to the new HPB primary site, one is for the primary site of breast, and one is for head and neck.
- The CoC has retired the quality measure for patients undergoing breast -conserving surgery without adjuvant chemo or immunotherapy for stage I-III breast cancer.

- The CoC has released the quality performance benchmarks for the four quality measures that must be reviewed with a program's cancer committee as part of Standard 7.1 compliance, starting with calendar year 2025.
