On behalf of the more than 90,000 members of the American College of Surgeons (ACS), I would like to express our strong support for the resolution designating March 18, 2024, as Health Workforce Well-Being Day of Awareness and for your ongoing work to support the mental and physical well-being of health care workers.

As you know, the capacity and well-being of the health care workforce is under significant strain. Health professionals have faced greater rates of mental and behavioral health conditions, suicide, and burnout than other professions for decades, while fearing the stigma and potential career repercussions of seeking care.
