



#### Lymphedema Treatment Act

- The final 2023 Congressional Spending Package folds in provisions of the Lymphedema Treatment Act, which expands Medicare coverage for lymphedemarelated pressure garments.
- The new coverage will go into effect in 2024 and could affect more than 3 million Medicare beneficiaries.





#### **About the Community Oncology Alliance (COA)**



- COA is a non-profit organization advocating on behalf of independent community oncology practices and the patients they serve
  - Independent, non-hospital-based community oncology serves the majority of patients with cancer in the U.S.
- Members from across the country form a volunteer, grassroots advocacy and professional association
  - Clinicians, pharmacists, nurses, patients, and other health care stakeholders are represented by COA
- COA's goal is to ensure that every American facing cancer has access to quality, affordable, and accessible cancer care in the communities where they live and work

#### Addressing Unnecessary Burdens and Impediments to Patient Care



- Ensure patients have timely access to high-quality, evidencebased, standard of care treatments
- Reduce interference of non-clinical middlemen/actors
  - PBMs and insurers that negatively impact patient care
- Fixing an out-of-control, broken, and burdensome utilization management system
  - Prior authorization
  - "Fail first" step therapy and formulary restrictions

#### Ensuring the Success and Viability of Independent Practice



- Seeking sustainable and equitable payments for independent practices
  - Tackling low or inadequate reimbursement (Annual Medicare fee schedule changes, Medicare sequestration, etc.)
  - Supporting a healthy community oncology workforce
- Creating a more level playing field between independent practices and other sites of service
  - Addressing site of service reimbursement differences
  - Fixing public policies that drive/feed consolidation

# Leading the Future of Quality Programs and Measurement



- Seeking solutions to ensure quality, improve the patient experience, and reduce total cost of care at all levels of health care system
  - Addressing cost drivers at all levels of the health care ecosystem
- Leading the next generation of oncology payment reform
  - Oncology Medical Home (OMH)
  - Enhancing Oncology Model (EOM) and other government models
- Aligning stakeholders (insurers, employers, government, providers) on quality programs and measures
  - Reducing burden of numerous quality measurement/reporting programs
- Ensuring appropriate quality measures for oncology practices and pharmacies
  - Developing appropriate oncology pharmacy quality/performance measures around orals and prescribing

#### **How COA Addresses Priorities**



- A national and state advocacy network for practices to drive change
- Network practices to share resources and knowledge
  - Practice administrators (CAN)
  - Pharmacists (COPA)
  - Oncology/Hematology fellows
  - Patients (CPAN)
- Robust array of support and tools for practice operation
- Research and thought leadership

#### Current Work

- Steering Committees recently met to review their workplans and determine how best to incorporate NAACCR's strategic initiatives
- Due to volunteer workload, it will not be feasible to immediately focus on all initiatives
- Assessing/Updating Certification for registries is a high priority area
- Work on defining a minimal data set has begun



## Mid-Level Tactical Group

- Oversees the change management and implementation of NAACCR Data Standards
  - Reviews proposed changes to NAACCR data standards and makes recommendations to the High-Level Strategic Group
  - Ensures change implementation progresses according to schedule
- Comprised of representatives from standard-setting organizations, including NCDB and AJCC

### Mid-Level Tactical Group

#### Challenges

- Different stakeholder needs
- Accelerating pace/frequency/volume of changes
- Limited opportunity to fully assess impact of changes
- Increasingly complex systems
- Complex interdependencies are not well documented
- Processes are evolving and not well understood
