Dr. Ibrahim is the Maude T. Lane Research Professor of Surgery, Architecture & Urban Planning at the University of Michigan and Vice Chair of Health Services Research. He Co-Directs the Center for Healthcare Outcomes and Policy which has \$30 million in active funding. He is the Principal Investigator of two R01s (AHRQ, NIH-NIDDK) evaluating hospital system performance and geospatial policy evaluations of access to surgical care. He completed his undergraduate and medical degrees education both with Honors at Case Western Reserve University with a year of coursework at University College London and The Bartlett School of Architecture. In addition to his health services research degree from the University of Michigan as a Robert Wood Johnson Clinical Scholar, he completed additional policy training as a Crile Fellow at Princeton University and as a Doris Duke Fellow at Johns Hopkins Hospital.
