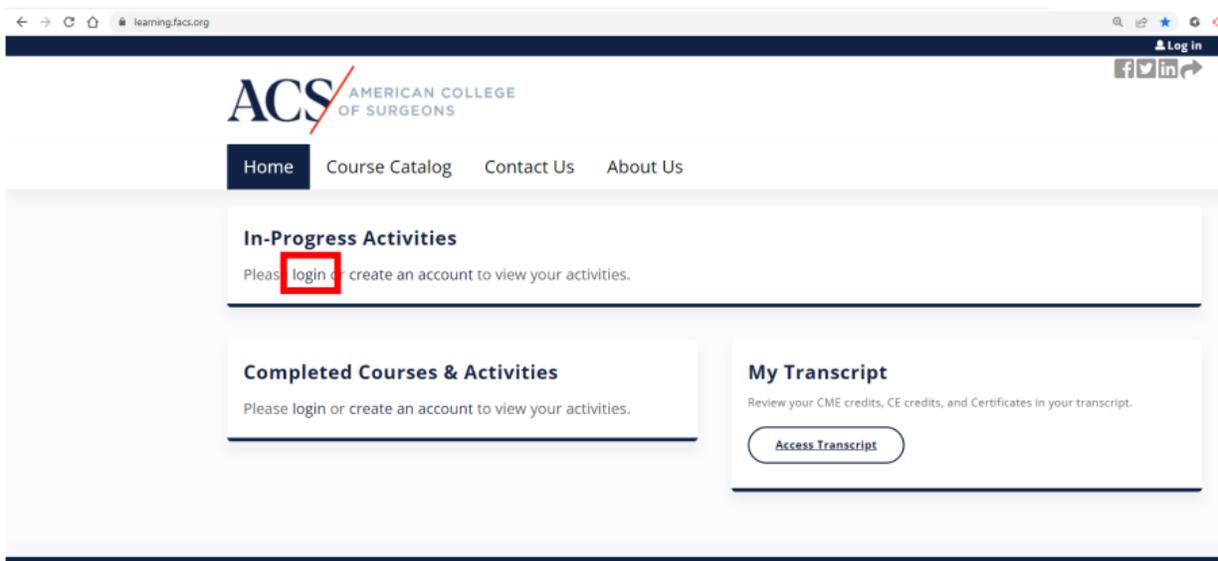


Claiming Credit for the 2026 ATLS Global Symposium

PLEASE NOTE: Credit Claiming ends on May 15, 2026.

1. Log into the learning.facs.org website using your username/password.

If you do not know your ACS username/password, still click on Login.



2. Click on 'Forgot Password?'

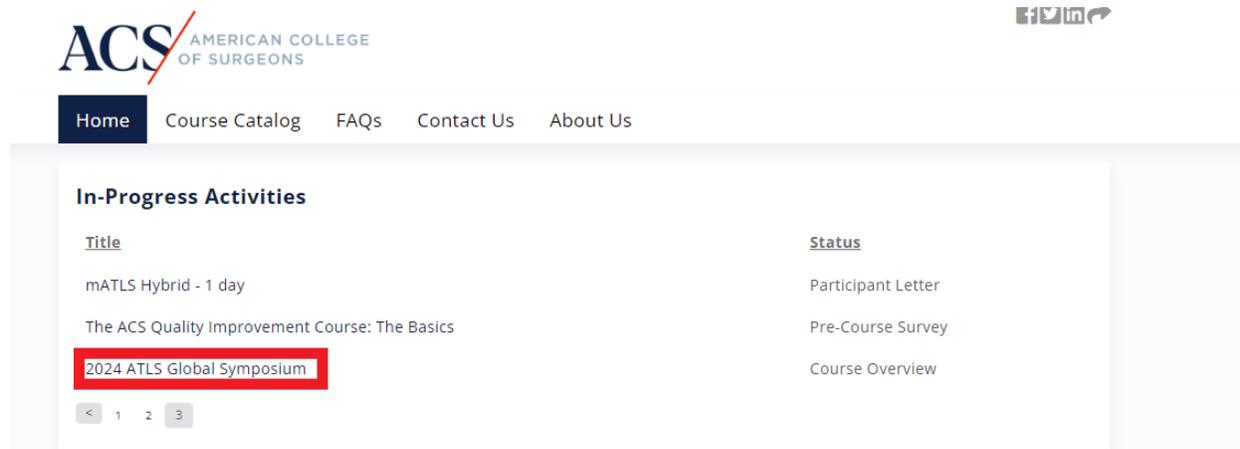

5. You will then be directed to the Learning Management System Platform. If you are not already logged in, you can log in with your ACS username/password.

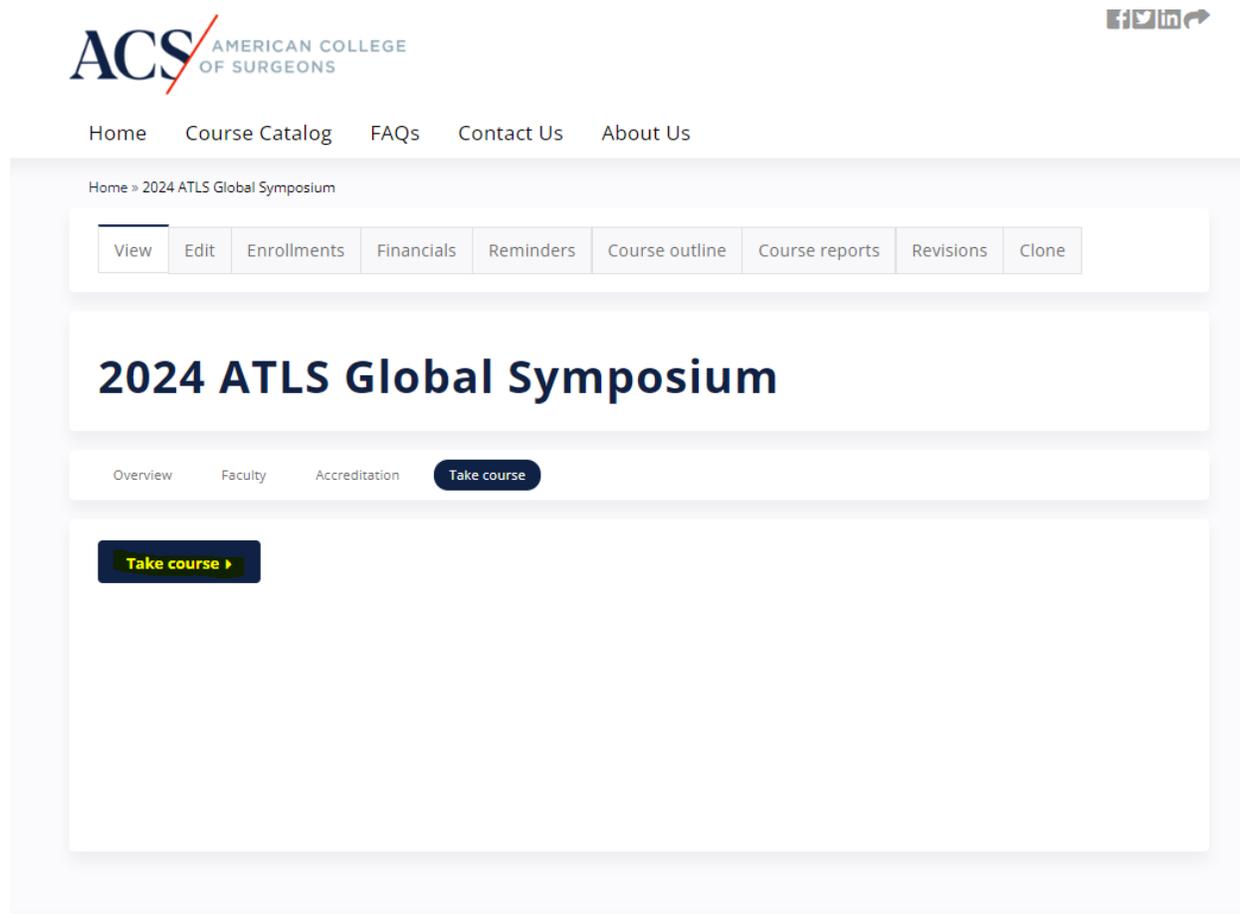
