At the end of World War II, surgeons who had served during the conflict gathered at the Excelsior Hotel in Rome, Italy, to discuss their experiences. This meeting was the first of what would be called the Excelsior Surgical Society. These meetings continued annually until the death of the last World War II member, Dr. Michael DeBakey.

The Excelsior Surgical Society also aims to reinvigorate the Senior Visiting Surgeon Program and provide mentorship opportunities for military medical students, residents, and active duty surgeons.

COMMITTEES

Diversity and Inclusion Committee

One of our newer committees, the Diversity and Inclusion Committee was created to address issues unique to women and minority surgeons serving in the Armed Forces as well as to promote an inclusive program and membership.

Membership Committee

The Membership Committee has worked with the ACS to provide <u>discounted dues</u> for military members for both Excelsior and ACS membership.

Mentorship Committee

This committee was formed to provide resources for the education, residency, professional development, and CME needs of military surgeons. They have been focused on building and expanding our network of military surgical providers as well as providing mentorship throughout their careers.

Outreach Committee

We continue to spread our message as well as news of our Society through the Outreach Committee. The Outreach Committee showcases the achievements of military surgeons, expands fellowship, and highlights opportunities for military surgeons across academic societies through multiple platforms.

Program Committee

The ESS holds an annual full-day symposium that is attended by active, reserve, and retired military surgeons, residents, and students in conjunction with the ACS Clinical Congress. During the Clinical Congress, the Program Committee also organizes the Pryor Lecture, the Churchill Lecture, and the Excelsior Surgical Society Reception.

Research Committee

During the ACS Clinical Congress, the Research Committee moderates the Region 13 ACS Committee on Trauma (COT) paper competition as well as a military-specific session focused on military-relevant research.
