Quality Program Area Overview

The goal of the TQIP Program Area and its workgroups is to advance and support high-quality care for trauma patients by defining standards of care; establishing tools and guidelines to help improve care; providing risk-adjusted benchmarking that measures quality and identifies areas for improvement; and enabling research to advance the field.

TQIP Program Area Vice Chair General Responsibilities

This position functions as a program area vice chair; please refer to the general expectations/requirements for the program area vice chair position.

TQIP Program Area Vice Chair Specific Responsibilities

- Collaborate with the Trauma Quality Medical Director and the TQIP Program Area Chair to represent clinical considerations that inform all areas of the Trauma Quality Programs
- Lead program area related meetings and calls, as needed, in the absence of the Chair
- Collaborate with TQIP Program Area Chair, Medical Director, and staff to prepare for and attend COT member meetings in March and October, and TQIP annual conference
- Attend and serve as an active participant on bi-weekly TQIP Program Committee calls to prepare the scientific program for the TQIP conference. Participate in the abstract review process for the conference.
- With the TQIP Program Area Chair, ensure that adequate resources are made available to the different program or project areas, that subspecialty representation is deployed appropriately, and that IE principles are utilized in making assignments to ensure fair opportunity and engagement for all
- Provide strategic leadership and oversight to related workgroups as assigned, and serve as an active participant on the National Trauma Data Standard (NTDS) workgroup which meets virtually twice a year
- Partner with the Trauma Quality Program Medical Director and COT staff for the strategic planning and execution of all approved Quality Program Area and TQIP related activities
