
MEDCOM (Day to Day Operations)

Agreement to always accept trauma transfers between & among:

- University Hospital
- Brooke Army Medical Center (BAMC)
- Wilford Hall Medical Center (WHMC)

"No trauma patient will ever be stranded again"

Cooperation + Competition = "Coopetition"




MEDCOM and MCI Incidents

- Real-time bed status at Trauma Centers and other Emerg Depts
- Patient Navigation and Tracking for EMS and Air Medical
- Activation of Regional Mutual Aid







Regional Medical Operations Center – San Antonio (RMOC-SA)


- "EOC" for Medical issues (ESF-8), for EOC/DDC
- Fosters rapid consensus development among health professionals
- Allows needs and capabilities to be matched and addressed quickly



Regional Medical Operations Center – San Antonio (RMOC-SA)

- Responsible for:
 - Coordination of patient distribution (including co-horting)
 - EMS disaster response/coordination
 - Workforce/Equipment sharing
 - Evaluation of capacity/capability
 - Contribute to development of medical portion of media releases
 - Informs EOC of status changes and needs of healthcare/public health response

RMOC-SA Participants



RMOC Implementation Leads to Improved:

- Coordination between agencies and stakeholder
- Communication between agencies and facilities
- Distribution of resources
- Understanding of local need
- Information sharing
- Patient tracking

Regional Medical Operations Center – Katrina/Rita response

- Hospitals and Shelters
 - Patients (108 planes/36 hrs, 98 FEMA, 10 NDMS)
 - Acute hospitalized patients -- 535 patients
 - Special needs patients/evacuees -- 1,500 patients
 - Non-medical evacuees -- 25,000
 - Equitable and efficient distribution to hospitals
