### Recommended Case Data Collection

Case recording in the Surgeon Specific Registry (SSR) now includes clinically relevant variables flagged with an asterisk for preoperative risk factors, intraoperative variables, and postoperative outcomes. Regularly collecting these variables enhances the value of your SSR Reports and Benchmarking Report, allowing you to compare individual data with aggregated SSR and NSQIP™ data.
