**Clue** Traditional size cutoff for indication for repair of AAA in men  
**Response** What is 5 cm?

400

**Clue** This post-arteriovenous fistula syndrome is characterized by pallor and diminished pulses in the ipsilateral hand which improve with compression of the fistula  
**Response** What is steal syndrome?

600

**Clue** Also the name of a common construction tool, this surgical procedure is used for the treatment of AV fistula steal syndrome  
**Response** What is a DRIL procedure?

800

**Clue** This lower extremity venous outflow obstruction is caused most commonly by compression of the left iliac vein by the right iliac artery  
**Response** What is May-Thurner syndrome?

1000

**Clue** This eponymous sign occurs in thoracic outlet syndrome, with loss of the radial pulse with rotation of the head to the ipsilateral side and extension of the neck  
**Response** What is Adson's sign?

**Clue** There is no somatic pain above this junction between the embryonic hindgut and the embryonic proctodeum

**Response** What is the dentate line?

**Clue** This is a full-thickness resection to address rectal prolapse in an elderly woman with comorbidities that preclude an abdominal operation

**Response** What is perineal rectosigmoidectomy (Altemeier or Delorme procedure)?

**Clue** This is the standard treatment for squamous cell carcinoma of the anal canal

**Response** What is chemoradiation (also accept Nigro protocol)?

800

**Clue** This rule helps anticipate the expected internal opening of a perianal fistula based upon the location of its external opening

**Response** What is Goodsall's rule?

**Clue** This is the eponym for intraepidermal adenocarcinoma of the anus

**Clue** This international criteria is used to determine candidacy for liver transplantation in the setting of HCC

**Clue** These four components make up the MELD-Na score used to list patients in order of priority for liver transplantation

**Clue** This is the largest size a hepatocellular carcinoma can be to still qualify for liver transplantation under Milan criteria

**Clue** This imaging study should be emergently performed on an acutely anuric fresh kidney transplant patient

**Clue** Due to this portion of the graft's susceptibility to hypoxia, this complication occurs more frequently in patients undergoing liver transplantation using a donation after circulatory death organ

**Clue** This radiographic finding is associated with colonic volvulus
