	Skill—Empty the Pouch (Colostomy/lleostomy of	only)		
1	Empty pouch when it is 1/3 to 1/2 full.			
2	Assemble supplies before emptying (toilet paper, pouch, deodorant if needed)			
3	Assume a correct position on toilet.			
4	Raise and open the pouch.			
5	Lower the opening into the toilet and empty.			
6	Wipe the opening before resealing.			
7	Add pouch deodorant (if used).			
8	Reclamp or reseal the pouch.			
	Skill—Empty the Pouch (Urostomy only)			
1	Empty pouch when 1/3 to 1/2 full.			
2	Assume a correct position.			
3	Raise and open the spout.			
4	Pinch the pouch opening.			
5	Point nozzle down, unpinch, and drain into toilet.			
6	Close the pouch nozzle.			
	Skill—Remove the Old Pouch (All stoma types)			
1	Assemble supplies for pouch change: new pouch, towel, measurement guide, pen, scissors, disposable garbage bag (skin paste, powder, and deodorant— <i>optional</i>).			
2	Remove the outer adhesive by starting at one corner.			
3	Place one hand on skin and push down while your other hand lifts up the barrier.			
4	Place the old pouch in garbage bag.			
5	If you are using a clamp, do not throw it away.

	Skill—Clean and Inspect (All stoma types)			
1	Check the skin for color, bleeding, and irritation.			
2	Clean the skin around the stoma with warm water.			
3	Pat the skin dry.			
	Skill—Measuring and Cutting the Opening (A	l stoma	types)	
1	Cover the stoma opening with a piece of tissue or gauze while measuring.			
2	Measure your stoma accurately with the measurement guide.			
3	Trace the correct size on the back of the pouch barrier.			
4	Place your finger into the pre-cut opening and push the pouch away from the barrier.			
5	Cut the traced opening.			
6	Check for fit by centering the new opening over the stoma and making sure it is close to stoma edge.			
	Skill—Applying the New Pouch (All stoma type	s)		
1	Remove the paper backing from the pouch barrier.			
2	Date and keep the paper from the backing to use as your next template.			
3	If needed, apply skin barrier paste/powder.			
4	Remove any gauze/tissue placed over the stoma.			
5	Center and apply the pouch skin barrier around the stoma and gently press onto the skin for 60 seconds, smoothing any creases.			
6	For a two-piece system, apply the pouch to the barrier flange.			
7	Correctly close the bottom opening of your pouch.			
	<i>For a Clamp Closure</i> —Wrap the tail around one time only. Lightly tug on the clamp once to make sure it is secure.			
	<i>For Integrated Closure</i> —Roll the bottom edge up and press securely across the entire closure, then use side closures.			
	<i>For a Urostomy</i> —Turn the tap to a closed position, place the cap on the nozzle or bend the nozzle up in the holder.
