The Advanced Trauma Life Support (ATLS) program is in the revision process for the 11th Edition. The current phase of the project is content development for the five main product lines: Student Manual, mATLS online modules, Skills Stations, Interactive Discussions, and Patient Scenario/Initial Assessment. Each content area has a Content Lead that oversees the development of all five product lines to ensure consistent messaging. To date, small workgroups have developed global competencies, learning objectives, and key learning points that will cover all product lines. The next phase of the project is to develop the content for each product line. There will be one product liaison per workgroup – so one person to lead mATLS online modules (or other product lines), and they will have workgroup members to help with the process.

There is a heavy focus on creating a flexible curriculum that is relevant and applicable to a variety of environments, mechanisms of injury, and resource availability.
